Behavior Policy	
<p>The Shawano Summer School Staff works very hard to provide a safe and fun learning environment for students. Summer school is an enriching opportunity and privilege. Students need to understand their behavior must meet the same expectations given during the normal school year.</p> <p>Our staff understands there are times when students need redirection for their behavior. However, serious offenses will be directed to the summer school administrator. The administrator will inform parents of these offenses and determine the appropriate consequences, which may include a removal from all summer school activities for up to five days. Students who repeatedly display disrespectful or unsafe behaviors, or commit extreme behavior offenses, will lose their privilege to attend summer school for the remainder of the five-week session.</p>	



ADVICE ON CHOOSING CLASSES

The summer school administration recommends that parents and students keep in mind the following when selecting summer school classes:



- Summer school should be a fun learning experience. That means students and parents should seek a balance between fun and academics when choosing classes.
- Most students will take four classes. We recommend taking **at least one class with a strong academic focus** (Reading, Writing, & Math).
- Summer school is also a time to pursue an interest for which there is not sufficient time in the regular school year. A course such as family history or drama are great examples.
- Pay attention to the new classes. These are courses proposed by teachers or recommended by administration to make summer school a unique and valuable learning experience! Many of the courses added to this year's catalog are aimed at 7th & 8th graders who may need a different type of experience to be interested in summer school.

Language and Literacy Classes

#101-FUN WITH SPANISH = GRADES 3 – 8

Students will gain an appreciation for the Spanish language. They will learn to say the alphabet, colors, numbers, days, months, and seasons in Spanish. Student will also be exposed to the culture through books, videos and Spanish food.

***#102-HOGWARTS 1 – OWLS-ENRICHMENT = GRADES 4 – 8**

***#103-HOGWARTS 2 – NEWTS-ENRICHMENT = GRADES 4 – 8**

Hogwarts has come to Shawano! Come to the Great Hall, be sorted by the Sorting Hat, and meet your classmates as you compete for House Points and try to win the House Cup. Play Quidditch, run the Tri-Wizard Tournament, and test your knowledge of the wonderful world of Harry Potter. Discussions in class will help to “dig deeper” into the literature, and we will examine the differences between the movies and the books. you will make foods, sing filks, make some Harry Potter crafts, and, if you work very hard, you may be named a prefect or Head Boy or Girl! Grab your broomstick and join us for a great summer!

***OWLS:** The OWLS class is designed for students who have seen the movies, but may or may not have read many of the books. If you have not read the books, you should sign up for the OWLS section.

***NEWTS:** The NEWTS class is designed for students who have read the books and are ready to delve deeper in discussions and activities. **STUDENTS MAY NOT SIGN UP FOR BOTH OWLS AND NEWTS in the same summer!**

*Note- We have had to combine OWLS and NEWTS the past couple of summers due to low enrollment.

#104-LITTLE HOUSE ON THE PRAIRIE = GRADES 4 – 8

For anyone who has ever loved Laura Ingalls Wilder and her classic tales of pioneer life, this is the class for you! Go back in time to the days of Laura by reading excerpts, creating crafts, making recipes, and playing games all based on the beloved Little House books.

#105-READING 1 = GRADE 3

#106-READING 2 = GRADES 4 – 5

#107- READING 2 = GRADES 6 – 8

This exciting class will allow students to become independent readers by focusing on learning by discovery. Students will explore interesting and motivating texts, which will promote strategies to improve on reading comprehension skills. Students will experience a variety of stimulating activities such as playing age appropriate language games, singing, and playing movement games.

*Grade combinations for these courses may shift based on student enrollment.

#108-WRITING = GRADES 3 – 4

#109-WRITING = GRADES 5 – 8

This is a class for students who both love writing and want to get better at it, or for those students who have not liked writing and need to find new reasons to enjoy it. Students will be given fun, real world tasks to help them to work on their written communication skills. Students will explore the imaginations of several authors while developing their own writing skills. Games and projects will be designed to make students see the importance of writing and have fun while doing it! Students will be encouraged come join the fun in creating stories, explore the endless possibilities that imagination presents, and learn to have fun while writing.

*We will attempt to divide this course into two sections for younger and older students, but enrollment has not supported that in the past.

Mathematics

#110-MATH BLAST 1 = GRADES 3 – 4

#111-MATH BLAST 2 = GRADES 5 – 8

This class is designed for high level math students who enjoy doing math. The class will be tailored to each individual's math abilities and interests. The use of manipulatives will be stressed. **This class is designed for students who already do well in math and have a high interest in math.**

#112 MATH & BEYOND 1= GRADES 3 – 4

#113 MATH & BEYOND 2 = GRADES 5 – 6

In this class, students will go beyond basic math facts and skills to think creatively, reason, and work collaboratively to build successful and essential math habits. Students will be challenged to work with their peers to solve logic tasks, use technology for coding games and stories, and many more fun enrichment activities. **This class is designed for students who have average or above average math skills, and who usually enjoy math classes.**

#114- EVERYDAY MATH 1 - BASIC = GRADES 3 – 4

#115- EVERYDAY MATH 2 – BASIC = GRADES 5 – 8

Everyday Math is a class designed to help students who have experienced difficulty in understanding basic math concepts and need extra help. This course reviews addition, subtraction, solving strategies, and work with time and money. Skills are developed and/or reviewed through math games and activities. A goal of this class is to build confidence, ability, and interest in mathematics! **This class is designed for students who have struggled in math and/or have not enjoyed math classes.**

Arts, Culture, and Creativity

#120-ART WORKSHOP = GRADES 3 – 8

This class is for students who have an imagination and love to draw and color. Let the world be your palette! We will create tie dye t-shirts and multicultural art. Come join the fun!

#121-CLASSIC FILM = GRADES 3 – 8

Summer is a great time for movies! Classic, school appropriate films will be watched and discussed. Students will have a role in picking the films and will be challenged to understand them in the context of history, geography, and film-making. New films will be chosen for students who are retaking the class. Join us for some summer movie-watching fun!

#122-CRAFTY CARDS = GRADES 3 – 8

Are you creative? Do you enjoy making things for others? If the answer is “yes”, Crafty Cards is the class for you! Students will make homemade cards for all occasions like birthdays, Christmas, and “just because” times! In this class learners will use different crafting techniques such as stamping, paper folding, and flocking.

#123-CREATION STATION = GRADES 3 – 8

Do you like creating crafts in your free time? Then Creation Station is the class for you! In this class you will have the chance to work with many different craft materials to create different projects. We will be working with Perler beads, creating suncatchers from recycled CDs, painting animal banks, working with Sculpey clay, plastic lacing key chains and much, much more. Come and create a work of art at the Creation Station!

#124-DESTINATION IMAGINATION = GRADES 3 – 8

Are you someone who thinks outside of the box? Do you like working in a team to solve challenges? If that is you, you will love this new class. Students will have an opportunity to do improv, community work, conflict resolution, and have fun working in small groups on fun challenges. This class will be a five-week version of the Destination Imagination program available throughout the school year.

#125- INTRO TO DRAMA = GRADES 3 – 8

Experience firsthand what it takes to be an onstage personality. We will explore body movement, vocal interpretation, and how to assemble these skills into a complete scene/play. Students will develop and perform a play, utilizing costumes, props, and lighting for a final performance the last week of summer school. Fun guaranteed! ACTORS: Please dress comfortably for each rehearsal; wear shoes that have backs (for safety).

#126-FUN WITH CRAFTS = GRADES 3 – 8

Do you like to cut, glue, paint, sew, and create? If yes, sign up to craft a wide variety of projects in this fun class! Students in this class will make new objects out of throw away containers. Students may also craft toys, create jewelry, banners, and/or keepsakes. These are just a few of the possible activities in sort for crafters.

#127-MESSIN' WITH CLAY = GRADES 3 – 8

Do you enjoy working with clay? If you do, then why not get your hands dirty this summer, and create some cool artwork in "Messin' with Clay". You will be learning different ways to hand-build clay containers and clay sculptures. Your finished clay projects will then be glazed and "fired" in a kiln. You will also get the opportunity to work with other types of art clay such as "Sculpey".

#132-OH MY ORIGAMI = GRADES 5 – 8

Origami is the Japanese art of folding paper into things such as animals, flowers, and 3D objects. In this class, students will have the opportunity to learn basic folding techniques and origami bases to make over 30 different creations. We will read the book, "Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes", and then of course, learn to fold cranes like she did. We will experiment with different size pieces of paper, with all kinds of fun patterns on them. Many of the things we will make use just one piece of paper, but a few involve putting several pieces together (modular origami) to make the final object. This is a very "hands on" class, as hands are the only things you will need to make all kinds of fun paper creations

#128-SCRAPBOOKING 1 = GRADES 4 – 8

Students in this class will have a lot of fun creating unique projects to keep and/or give away to someone special. The only limit is your imagination! Scrapbookers will use images, photos, memorabilia, journaling, and embellishments to create a work of art. Tips on how to be "green" in scrapbooking will save a lot of money, too!

***#129-SCRAPBOOKING 2 – ADVANCED = GRADES 5 – 8 (2-hour class)**

This is a class for students who have already taken scrapbooking. Scrapbookers may "continue" to update the scrapbook they have already created and learn new additional "tips" and "techniques". Students will also have time to create a digital scrapbook and save it to a CD. Sign up for some scrapbooking fun!!

*We have not been able to run this class the past two years due to low numbers. Pick it if it interests you; be sure to include strong alternates.

#130-STRING THINGS = GRADES 3 – 8

Do you enjoy crafts and making and designing your own things? If so, String Things is the class for you! In this class students will learn how to make jewelry with different types of beads and also learn to make macramé bracelets. Students will also be learning how to cross stitch and work with plastic canvas. Sign up for this fun class and grow your imagination this summer!

#131-WORLD'S LARGEST SUPER COOL MIDDLE SCHOOL STRING ORCHESTRA = GRADES 6 – 8

This performance group is open to any student who has had prior experience playing violin, viola, cello, and bass and would like to perform with others in a large group setting. Great for middle school string students who are planning on returning to their instruments in the fall! Students entering this class should be prepared to perform for the entire summer school at some point.

Family Life

#135-FAB FOODS 1 = GRADES 3 – 4**#136-FAB FOODS 2 = GRADES 5 – 8**

Fab Foods 1 & 2 are courses designed to teach kids to make and prepare food with the supervision of an adult. Students will learn correct and safe cooking procedures. We'll spend time preparing breakfasts, lunches, dinners, snacks, and desserts. We will also study nutrition and celebrate each of the five food groups.

#137-MICROWAVE MAGIC = GRADES 3 – 8

Do you like to cook? Did you know that you can make just about any type of food in a microwave oven? If you said no...then you should join us for some Microwave Magic!! Learn how to make easy after school snacks, desserts, even a whole meal. Breakfast, lunch, dinner... whatever you can think of – it's Microwave Magic!

#138-BABYSITTING & CHILDCARE = GRADES 4 – 8 (Not Red Cross Certified**)**

This course will teach the techniques and skills of proper and safe babysitting. This course is for both boys and girls. Upon completing the required course, students will know about: Babysitting Responsibilities, Characteristics of Children, Safe Toys and Games, Accident Prevention, Emergency Actions, Basic Care of Children.

Physical Education and Activities

#140-DANCERSIZE 1 = GRADES 3 – 5

#141-DANCERSIZE 2 = GRADES 6 – 8

Dancercise is a five-week program where students learn several disciplines of dance. Energizing types of Aerobics, Country line dancing, Ballroom dancing, Jazz/Ballet dancing, Tap dancing, Pom Pon/Cheerleading, and popular hip-hop dancing may be covered. There will be a dance recital during the last week of classes for friends and family to get a chance to see the participants in action.

***#142- FUN IN THE POOL = GRADES 3 – 8**

Looking for a little SPLASH this summer? Then this is the class for you! We will have individual activities as well as team games that will help students learn collaboration, and good sportsmanship. Be prepared for Sharks & Minnows, Marco Polo, Treasure Dive, I Spy, Rainbow Dive, Duck Push, Ping Pong Scramble, Bobbing Heads, Sponge Scrabble, and Popsicle Tag. We will also try to slip in some water related science activities and boat-building that will promote critical thinking, engineering, and problem solving.

*This class will be at the high school (the middle school does not have a pool). Students will ride a shuttle bus and will be a little late to subsequent classes.

***#143-BACKYARD SOFTBALL 1 = Grades 3 – 5 – GIRLS ONLY**

***#144-BACKYARD SOFTBALL 2 = Grades 6 – 8 – GIRLS ONLY**

This class will focus on teaching the basic fundamentals of the game of softball. The students will have fun learning how to throw, catch, hit, and play softball. Athletes will participate in many games throughout the five weeks to build upon these skills.

*Note- Last summer the two levels had to be combined due to low numbers.

***#145-FUNDAMENTALS OF BASEBALL 1 = GRADES 3 – 4 BEGINNER**

***#146-FUNDAMENTALS OF BASEBALL 2 = GRADES 5 – 6 INTERMEDIATE**

***#147-FUNDAMENTALS OF BASEBALL 3 = GRADES 7 – 8 ADVANCED**

This class will focus on the basic fundamentals of the game of baseball. Athletes will have fun learning how to throw, catch, bat, bunt, and develop other skills of effective baseball players.

*Note- The different levels of this course often have to be combined due to enrollment numbers.

***#148-GIRLS' BASKETBALL 1 = GRADES 5 & 6**

***#149-BOYS' BASKETBALL 1 = GRADES 5 & 6**

***#150-GIRLS' BASKETBALL 2 = GRADES 7 & 8**

***#151-BOYS' BASKETBALL 2 = GRADES 7 & 8**

Each day students will learn new drills which will help them become better in each aspect of basketball. The drills will progressively get more difficult as the students become more advanced. Class will include running drills and variations of 1-on-1, 2-on-2, 3-on-3, and 5-on-5 games. There will be a tournament during the last week of summer.

*Note- Classes may have to be combined depending on enrollment numbers.

#154-SPORTS BLAST = GRADES 3 – 8

Students will get the chance to learn local sports history such as the Super Bowl XXXI Packers and 1982 World Series Brewers. Students will learn the rules, play flag football, and even learn how to score the game of baseball using real scorebooks.

#155-SPORTS STRENGTH & CONDITIONING = First year Summer School lifters, Co-Ed (preferably 5th graders)

#156-SPORTS STRENGTH & CONDITIONING = Any interested students past 5th grade

Sports Strength & Conditioning is a training program designed to prepare athletes for any sport. This is NOT a weightlifting class trying solely to make athletes LOOK bigger! We combine training on numerous aspects of athletic ability (including flexibility, strength, speed, agility, quickness, coordination, plyometrics, and nutrition) in order to improve overall athletic performance, reduce the risk of injury, and promote a healthy lifestyle.

[SPORTS STRENGTH & CONDITIONING = GRADES 9 – 10 Co-Ed]

This class meets at the high school. Signup for this course is done on a different form, which can be found at the high school main office or by contacting Coach Rill at rillb@shawanoschools.com. This course will run three days a week from June 11th – August 2nd. Incoming freshman can take this class **or** the middle school option. If they take the high school version, no other summer school classes will fit in their schedule. Interested 8th graders should see Dr. Watson for a permission slip.

#158-TENNIS – BEGINNING = GRADES 3 – 8

This course is geared for beginning tennis players. Students will learn the basic strokes and terminology of the game. Skills will be taught through games and activities. Tennis racquets will be provided to those who need one. Come and enjoy this life time sport.

#159-TENNIS – INTERMEDIATE = GRADES 3 – 8

This course is geared towards students with some tennis experience. Students will work on improving their strokes and serve. Games and activities will be played to improve tennis skills. A round robin tournament will be played the final week of Summer School.

#160- VOLLEYBALL = BOYS & GIRLS, GRADES 3 – 5

Bump! Set! In this introductory class students will learn the basic rules of volleyball such as how to play on a court, how to substitute, how many hits on a side, and other basics to help build a base knowledge for the sport. Students will also learn the basic techniques and body positioning for bumping and setting along with serving. Fun drills to build basic skills will be done in order to play games. Students will find an enthusiasm for the sport of volleyball. (Students will be required to bring their own kneepads and tennis shoes in order to participate).

#161- VOLLEYBALL = BOYS & GIRLS, GRADES 6 – 8

SPIKE! Are you ready to play volleyball competitively? In this more advanced class of volleyball, girls will have the opportunity to review all the basics taught in the beginning class like rules and basic positioning. In addition, the girls will learn to play together with defense and offense. Setting and spiking will be practiced along with tougher drills for more competitive games with an emphasis on teamwork. This class will help prepare girls for middle school volleyball.

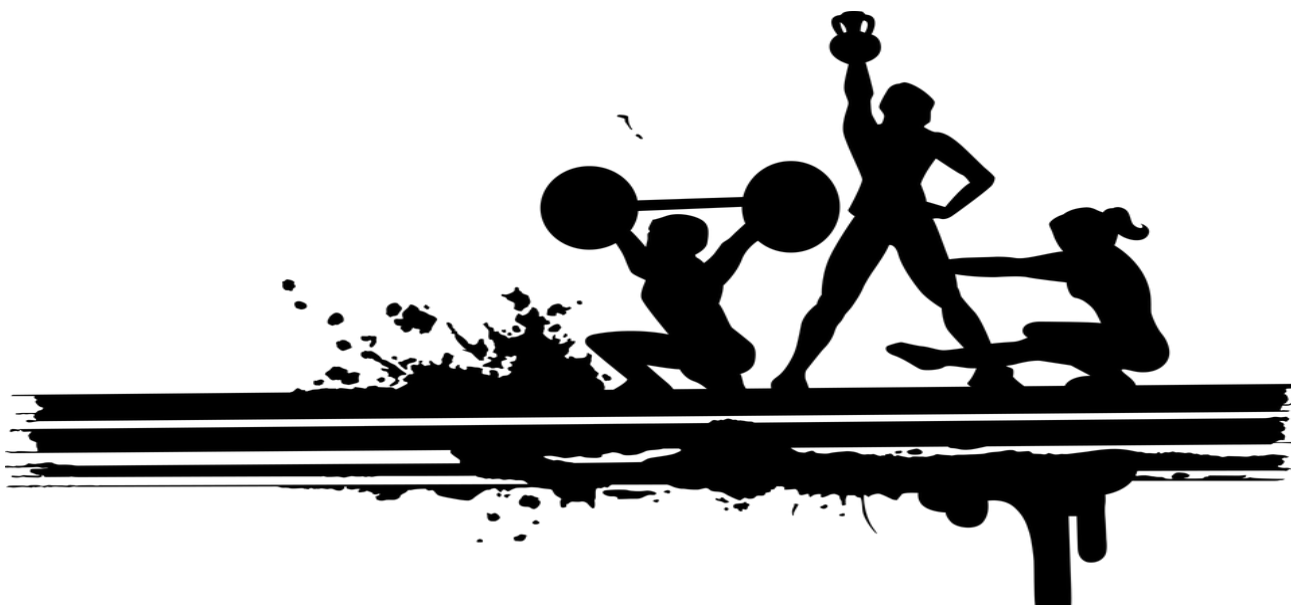
#162-WALKING CLUB = GRADES 3 – 8

Get your steps in! Students will walk, jog, and / or run using pedometers. Steps will be measured each day to see how far around the United States they can "travel" in this 5-week period. Students will learn about geography by using a map of the United States, as well as the benefits of exercise and how to make lifestyle changes for a long and healthy life!

#163 – SOCCER 2 = BOYS & GIRLS, GRADES 3 - 5**#164 – SOCCER 3 = BOYS & GIRLS, GRADES 6 - 8**

Each day students will focus on the fundamentals of the game of soccer. They will have opportunities to work on these skills through various drills and competitions. The drills will get progressively more challenging as students demonstrate their abilities. There will also be a "Summer Cup" (our version of the World Cup) tournament that will occur during the last week. During this class we will stress the importance of having fun while at the same time learning about the game of soccer!

*note- this class may be combined depending on enrollment numbers.



General Education

#175-CAMP 6TH GRADE: HOW TO SUCCEED IN MIDDLE SCHOOL = GRADE 5

Camp 6th Grade will concentrate on what it takes to be successful in middle school. It will include study skills for test taking, prioritizing homework, organizing materials, taking notes, time management and other middle school readiness skills. We will also look at how to read your schedule, how the A day/B day schedule works at the middle school, grade periods, extra – curricular activities that are offered for 6th grade students, using a lock, and take a tour of SCMS so you are ready for the first day of school! **This course is strongly recommended for all incoming middle schoolers!**

Note: Some of the focus of this class is specific to the Shawano Community Middle School, but students who intend to attend parochial schools are welcome to sign up!

#174-FRESHMAN ACADEMY: HOW TO SUCCEED IN HIGH SCHOOL = GRADE 8

Freshman Academy will help prepare incoming high school freshman by focusing on the habits and skills which have historically caused 9th graders to struggle. Friendship struggles, study habits, organization, self-advocacy, prioritization, how to deal with block schedules, career readiness, stress management, and extracurricular options are all discussed. This class is intended to help apprehensive 8th grade students (and their parents!) prepare for, get excited about, and do better in high school. **This course is strongly recommended for incoming high schoolers, particularly those who experienced some struggles in middle school!**

Recreation and Life

#165-FUN IN THE SUN 1 = GRADES 3 – 5

#166-FUN IN THE SUN 2 = GRADES 6 – 8

In this uplifting course students will discover and participate in a new game every day. The goal is to have fun learning educational and physically innovating games. While using fine and gross motor skills, students will socialize in group activities, role play, use their imaginations, and build self-esteem! Come along and have some fun in the sun!

#167-GET IN THE GAME 1 = GRADES 3 – 5

#168-GET IN THE GAME 2 = GRADES 6 – 8

Students will participate in games every day in this class. There will be daily class challenge games, as well as weekly tournaments. Students will be introduced to a wide variety of board & card games, ranging from Boggle to Tiddly Winks. The emphasis will be on learning to play by the rules and to have fun, win or lose.

#169-GO FISH! = GRADES 3 – 8

This class is for young people who either love to fish or haven't ever been fishing. From live bait, to lures, to casting – we will cover all the bases of fishing. We'll have a lot of hands-on fun, and that's no fish tale! This course will also include card games, board games, electronic games, outdoor games, and ethnic games.

#170-PINTEREST = GRADES 5 – 8

Students will pursue their individual interests in this class by exploring Pinterest, creating projects, and presenting to their peers. This class will develop students' skills at being self-starters, using creativity, solving problems, and pursuing their interests! This class will be a fun experience for (pin)terested students!

#171-STRATEGY GAMES = GRADES 5 – 8

Students will play strategy games such as chess, backgammon, and cribbage. The games will be more advanced than the ones offered in "Get in the Game". There will be game tournaments throughout this class.

#172-OUTDOOR SKILLS = GRADES 3 – 8

Students, who want to learn everything they need to know to survive in the wild, should join this class. Traditional activities like fishing, camping, and swimming will all be a part of this experience, but that's just the beginning. Have you ever been on an environmental scavenger hunt, built a shelter from nature, or cooked over an open fire? Join us for these and many more adventures!

Science and Social Studies

#180-ALL ABOUT ANIMALS = GRADES 3 – 8

Lions and tigers and bears OH MY!! But what about dogs, cows, and birds that fly? Come discover the animals that live all around us! Learn about different breeds, discover what animals are important to Wisconsin, and even make homemade pet treats! Students will learn from a veterinarian on how to keep animals healthy, make a visit to a farm, and have real animals visit the classroom. Students will also talk to a DNR warden about the creatures that live in the woods and swim in lakes. We will do all this and more as we work toward our honorary zoology degree!

#182-FAMILY HISTORY = GRADES 5 – 8

Students will dive into learning genealogy research using sources such as census records. Students will track down famous people in their family history while learning how to put different family records together. Students will discover their family's roots through America and beyond. A family tree will be the final project for this course. Parents and family members are welcome to come in and join young people during this class!

#183-LOCAL HISTORY = GRADES 3 – 8

Students will learn about the history of Shawano. Field trips to local sites, research at the library, guest speakers, and perhaps a grave marker rubbing will be part of this adventure. A final project will focus on one aspect of Shawano history and will teach students historical research, critical thinking skills.

#188-POST WWII HISTORY = GRADES 6 – 8

Starting over after the changes World War 2 brought, this kid friendly course will teach you all about the Cold War (Korea, Germany, Cuba), the conservative 1950's, the role that young adults played in the 1960's with Vietnam & Civil Rights, the Presidencies of Nixon, Ford, and Carter and onto the 1980's & 90's with Reagan, Bush, Clinton. We will finally learn of the roots of 9/11 as well as Operation Iraqi Freedom and the War in Afghanistan.



The class will allow students to learn by creating cool projects such as games, posters, videos, etc...and listening to the music that defined each decade. Designed and taught by Mr. Chitwood himself!

#184-MYTHOLOGY – MUSES, MONSTERS, & MUCH MORE! = GRADES 3 – 8

Percy Jackson piqued the interest of many current readers. Delve into discovering more about mythological monsters and muses, and the gods and goddesses who manipulated humankind!

#185-NATURE'S STRENGTH = GRADES 3 – 8

Mother Nature has many powerful forces. The six forces students will discuss are lightning, tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, and volcanoes. Students will find out why these events take place and learn the damages that a natural disaster can cause on a community. We will also use experiments and videos to better understand why these events happen.

#186-PSYCHOLOGY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE = GRADES 6 – 8

Psychology is the study of how people think, learn, behave and interact with each other. In this class, students will learn more about themselves and those around them. Students will explore their own multiple intelligences, learning styles, and how their brain really works. #187-SCIENCE IS FUN = GRADES 3 – 8

Student's eyes will be opened to the exciting world of science as they conduct a variety of enjoyable and thought-provoking hands-on experiments. This course will promote inquiry and exploration and allow students to learn about the world around them. Addition from this year's teacher- Do you like to build things? Come engineer with us and create replica structures that can withstand the forces of nature. We will learn about compression, tension, and more! This is a very popular course.

Computers and Technical Education

#190-COMPUTER SKILLS = GRADES 3 – 8

This computer course starts students with the basics and gradually builds their skill sets. Through interesting lessons, activities and projects, Computer Skills is able to present 3rd through 8th grade students with core computing concepts and applications while having fun! Student lessons will combine basic computer and technology concepts with hands-on step-by-step activities. #191-TOOL TIME 1 = GRADES 3 – 5

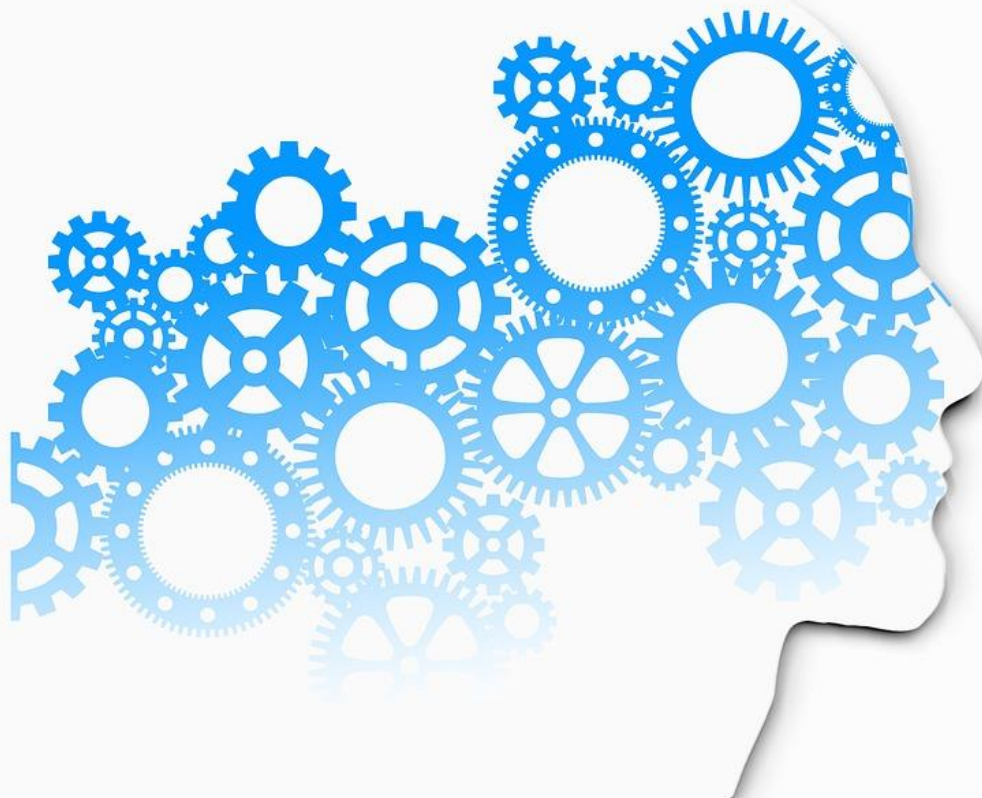

#192-TOOL TIME 2 ADVANCED = GRADES 6 – 8

We will study the finishing procedure for preparing and applying an oil-based stain and varnish on a project, construct a wall or table clock while applying band saw, router, drill press, sander, and circular saw skills.

#193-EXPLORING TECH = GRADES 6 – 8

Students will have the opportunity to see the fun side of Technology Education. In the Exploring Technology class students will have the chance to build a variety of fun projects. Throughout the class the students will build a car powered by a mouse trap, CO2 powered glider, a solid fuel rocket, and a rubber band powered boat. Come with a willingness to learn!
